We invite you to join us for the Give a Day Campaign. Together we will champion health and human rights to end AIDS! Your support is crucial in our global effort against the HIV epidemic.

Globally, the HIV epidemic remains a profound challenge, claiming 630,000 lives in 2023 — more than one life every minute. Despite progress, 1.3 million people acquired HIV last year. Almost 40 million people are living with the virus, predominantly in countries in sub-Saharan Africa where it is still a significant public health threat.

For over two decades, the Stephen Lewis Foundation has raised over \$200 million to support our grassroots partners across sub-Saharan Africa. These community organizations are on the frontlines, protecting those who suffer the greatest impact of HIV — children, especially girls, women and LGBTIQ communities.

An annual initiative since 2004, Canadians mark World AIDS Day on December 1st by donating one day's pay to the SLF. Your contribution will directly empower our partners to create a transformative impact in the lives of those affected by HIV.

By participating, you become a champion of health and human rights, aligning with a foundation that embodies anti-colonial, anti-racist and feminist values, ensuring sustainable change within communities.



The Power of One Day's Pay: A mother's shop and a child's education

Your one day's pay supports women entrepreneurs like Joyce to provide for their families and give back to their communities.

Joyce begins her day opening up the successful cereal shop she runs in Kibera, Nairobi's largest informal urban settlement. Members of her community recognize her, as she is a well-known leader who is making important contributions to her community. As a change-maker and mobilizer, her expertise is valued by her community and respected by politicians. On any given day, you could spot her working as a home-based care provider, peer educator, and advocate.

She is one of many grandmothers supported by Young Women Campaign Against AIDS (YWCAA), a Stephen Lewis Foundation partner and community-based organization in Kenya that connects women with the resources and support they need to achieve their goals.

When Joyce first connected with YWCAA, she was running a small business from her one-room home. Recognizing her industrious nature, YWCAA introduced Joyce to their "BAWA" program that supports women working as bar waitresses who are at high risk of violence. Through this economic empowerment program, Joyce received a small loan to start a cereal shop.

The training Joyce received along with the initial investment in her new business venture was just what she needed. Daily, she applies everything that she has learned, including record keeping, customer service, and investing. She was able to use the funds given to her through the program to access more credit options for the business and to pay school fees for her son who is today attending law school. Thanks to our Stephen Lewis Foundation supporters and partnership with YWCAA, Joyce has been able to improve and grow her business so that she can now give a hand up to those in her community who may still be struggling.

Building a home and a legacy: Esther Gopito

At 71 years of age, Esther Gopito is parenting three grandchildren who are 8, 12, and 15. Like many African grandmothers who are raising the next generation, Esther courageously and compassionately embraces the responsibility and the challenge. Her grandchildren are her pride and joy.

After she lost her husband, Esther had to shoulder the responsibility of caring for her grandchildren by herself and struggled to make ends meet for her family. In 2014, Esther joined a grandmothers support group with Farm Orphan Support Trust (FOST). An SLF partner since 2008, FOST was created to respond to increasing numbers of children who had lost their parents to AIDS-related illnesses in Zimbabwe. Today this community-led organization continues to provide vital care and support to those who need it most.

Thanks to FOST's support, Esther now runs a small farm. Initially, FOST equipped Esther with the tools she needed as well as a few chickens to launch an income-generating poultry project. She saved her earnings, and

through FOST's savings and loans group, she borrowed the money she needed to invest in more livestock and increase her household income. She's hoping to build fences for her livestock and purchase fertilizer to improve her crops. Esther is able to provide for her grandchildren and support their education. Her life is transformed and she is planning for her family's future.

Thanks to SLF supporters like you who stand in solidarity with our community partners, grandmothers like Esther are accessing the resources they need to create safe and healthy environments for their grandchildren to grow, learn, and build hopeful futures.

Frequently Asked Questions

Can my friends, family, colleagues, and other networks get involved?

Yes! If you have a customized fundraising page, you can share the link with them. On your page, they will be able to learn more about the campaign, see your progress, and donate in support. Or, you can simply direct them to thesslf.org/giveaday.

And, whether you are donating as an individual or as part of a team, you can nominate 3 people to take the Give a Day Challenge and donate one day's pay. See details on the challenge on page 5 of this toolkit. We can also provide you with resources to share at your workplace, and with anyone interested in joining the Give a Day Campaign.

How do we get the funds we raise to the SLF?

There are a few different ways to send funds raised to the SLF. The easiest way is through an online donations page, which we can help you to set up for individuals' contributions in support of you or your team. Another option is to collect donations and make a one-time gift on behalf of those donors. In this case, to issue tax receipts to individuals, your Give a Day Champion will need to provide the SLF with donor information for each gift in the cumulative total. You can also send money orders by wire transfer and we accept cheques. All donations must be accompanied by donor information.

To issue a tax receipt, we require the donor's full name and mailing address, including a postal code and the donation amount. According to CRA regulations, even emailed tax receipts require a full mailing address in Canada.
