- Manage consultant contracts and lead all qualitative and quantitative reporting requirements for GAC-funded projects.
- Collaborate with SLF's finance team to oversee expenditures and ensure financial accountability.
- Ensure project learnings inform SLF's advocacy, communications, and fundraising strategies.
