- Protects global health


Since 2002, the Global Fund has saved **65 million lives** and helped reduce the combined death rate related to HIV, TB and malaria by more than **60**%.

What makes it so effective?

The Global Fund's strength lies in partnership and scale:

- Governments and donors unite to provide unparalleled financial resources.
- Civil society, health providers, researchers, and community leaders ensure funds have maximum local impact.
- Countries lead their own response, tailoring strategies to their political, cultural and epidemiological realities.

In addition, the Global Fund invests in health systems strengthening, building "climate-resilient, crisis-ready health and community systems that serve people in the poorest and most marginalized communities."



2025: A year for bold leadership

The Global Fund operates on three-year funding cycles, known as replenishments. This year is a replenishment year and a defining moment for Canada.

By stepping up with a pledge of \$457 million a year (\$1.37 billion over 3 years), Canada can show the leadership the world urgently needs.

With full funding, the Global Fund could save 23 million additional lives and cut death rates from these diseases by another 64%.

Canada's pledge can be the catalyst that inspires other countries to match our ambition, ensuring this global partnership delivers on its promise of a healthier, more just world.
